IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN.

I, GEORGE B. HOFFMAN, of the Township of Fox, County of Elk, and State of Pennsylvania, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make, publish and declare the following to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made:-

FIRST, After all my just debts and funeral expenses shall have been paid by my executors, hereinafter named, it is my will that a tombstone shall be erected in my family lot in St. Marys Cemetery for myself and also one for my wife, after her decease, and that the sum of two hundred dollars shall be expended for masses for the repose of my soul and the souls of the deceased members of my family, and after my wife's death there shall also be expended the further sum of two hundred dollars for masses for the repose of her soul and the souls of the deceased members of my family.

SECOND, It is my will that after my death, as soon as may be conveniently be done, or as soon as my executors shall think it necessary, all the property of whatever nature or description and wherever situate at the time of my decease, whether real, personal or mixed, shall be sold by my executors, and the proceeds of the sale thereof shall be used by my executors as follows:- The amount of money received from the sale of my property shall be invested by my executors, and the interest or profits shall be used to support my beloved wife, Margaret Hoffman, in comfort for the remainder of her life, and if the interest or profits on the money received from the sale of my property shall not be sufficient to support my said wife, Margaret Hoffman, in comfort, then the principal or corpus shall be used in sufficient amounts or amount to give her the necessary comfortable support to which she is entitled, for the remainder of her life; and after the death of my said beloved wife, Margaret Hoffman, whatever remains of my estate, after carrying out fully the above stated provisions, shall be divided as follows:- To my son, Louis J. Hoffman, the sum of one dollar; to my son, Fred Hoffman, the sum of one dollar; to my daughter Caroline Hoffman, the sum of one dollar, she is now married and known as Caroline Harris; to my son, Herman G. Hoffman, the sum of one dollar. Each of the foregoing named children to whom I have bequeathed the sum of one dollar I have legally given their "time", and it is my will that they shall not participate in any part or parcel of my estate, except what I have willed them in this paragraph. The amount remaining after the above provisions shall have been faithfully carried out by my executors shall be equally divided as follows:- To my children Annie Hoffman Spangler, Henry J. Hoffman, William H. Hoffman, Anthony Hoffman, Minnie Hoffman, share and share alike.

THIRD, I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife, Margaret Hoffman, and my son Henry Hoffman to be executors of this, my last will and testament, and in the event of my wife's death before mine, or after mine, and before my said son's Henry J. Hoffman, I will that my said son Henry J. Hoffman, shall be my sole executor.
